Dear Mr. President,


We strongly support your plan to issue an Executive Order requiring federal contractors to pay service and construction employees at least \$10.10 an hour. This is an excellent first step, and we believe Congress should go further by raising the minimum wage for all American workers. As you prepare to issue this Executive Order, we hope you will ensure that those operating concessions in federal buildings, such as fast food businesses, be included in the scope of the Executive Order, so that their employees are also paid a fair wage.

We agree with your comments during your State of the Union address that no one who works full time should have to raise a family in poverty. Yet, many of those employers operating concessions do not pay their workers enough so that families can make ends meet. For example, facts show that the majority of workers in the \$200-billion-a-year fast food industry, many of whom work in concessions, are not untrained teenagers but actually family breadwinners. The median wage for core front-line workers at fast food restaurants nationally is only \$8.69 an hour, even though more than two-thirds of these workers are over the age of 20, and 68 percent are the main wage earners in their families. Additionally, more than a quarter of Americans working in fast-food restaurants are parents, raising at least one child.


Raising the wages of those people working concessions in federal buildings will provide an economic savings to American taxpayers. That's because workers in industries like fast food are paid so little that having to rely on public assistance is the rule, rather than the exception, even for those working 40 hours or more a week. A recent study found that 52 percent of fast food workers are forced to enroll their families in public assistance programs, such as Medicaid or food stamps.

Given the stagnation in the wages for working people, your Executive Order could not come at a better time. American workers deserve a raise, not just to ensure the federal government isn't depressing wages through the contracting process, but also for the health of our overall economy. We thank you again for issuing this Executive Order and urge you to ensure it will include all of those working in concessions, including fast food workers. Additionally, we pledge to continue to work with you to see an expeditious increase in the minimum wage.
